- understand that changes in the habitat of an organism may be beneficial or harmful
- understand that data are collected and interpreted in order to explain an event or concept

In our science classroom students will be instructed in the proper care and handling of rabbits and will be given the opportunity to assist in the care and handling of our class pet. In order for your child to do so she/he will need your consent. Please complete and sign the form below to give permission for your child to hold and care for Marshmallow. When making your decision with your child, please remember that our pet has a mouth and claws as many animals do and can bite or scratch. I would also appreciate it if you could inform me if your child is allergic to rabbits so that I may seat her/him in an area of the room to accommodate for that.
